Logistics

Location - The Summer Science Camp will be held at the Brandwein Nature Learning Preserve (BNLP), 400 Minisink Turnpike, Port Jervis New York. Directions signs will be posted on Minisink Turnpike directing parents to drop off.

Date: Monday – Friday July 25 – 29, 2016 – from 9:00 AM to 3PM daily. Parents are expected to drop off children and pick them up promptly.

Age range of day campers: 8 years to 14 years old by July 25th.

Meals and Snacks: Participants are expected to provide their own lunch, beverage and snacks. The Brandwein Institute will provide bottled water.

Incidentals – Participants should bring small back pack, sunscreen and insect repellent.

Cost and Registration: The cost for the 5-day science camp is \$50.00 (Payable to the Brandwein Institute by check the morning of July 25 at 8:30 AM). The final signup day is July 1, 2016 at Kaseystankunas@yahoo.com. (*Minimum number of participants to run Science Camp is 10, Maximum number of participants 45*)

Typical Day at Brandwein Science Camp

- 9:00-9:30- check in/free time
- 9:30-10:15- a nature exploration with “I wonder” questions, nature scavenger hunt, naturalist walk on BNLP Trails, etc.
- 10:30-12:00 - hands-on science project and/or nature scientist guest
- 12:00-1:00 - lunch and free time
- 1:00-2:30 - hands-on project or guest
- 2:30-3:00 – games
- 3:00 – parents pick up
